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2022 MISSION IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS



ORGANIZATIONAL GROWTH

On March 1, 2022, Princeton YMCA officially became a branch of Greater Somerset County YMCA. Our two neighboring nonprofits have a history of collaboration and the merger was the result of more than three years of analysis and planning. With a goal of enhancing our collective ability to strengthen the Y's mission, to best serve our communities, and to grow mission-impact programs to effectively support under-served populations, we have set our sights on building a bright future, together.



SPECIAL ANNIVERSARY

Since inception, our Saturdays in Motion (SIM) program has been transforming lives in profound ways. As the longest running, nonpublic recreational program for children with autism and special needs in the country, SIM celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2022. This achievement is attributable to all lead and teen volunteers, past and present. Their compassion creates an inclusive environment that helps participants to thrive while parents gain two hours of caregiving respite. Their commitment and service are priceless.

NEW SUMMER CAMP

In July 2022, our Franklin Township YMCA launched Camp SOAR to support under-resourced families from Bound Brook, South Bound Brook, Manville, and Franklin Township, who were affected disproportionately by the pandemic. The camp was made possible with funding from Somerset County through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Hosted at Colonial Park in partnership with the Somerset County Parks Commission, the affordable, enriching camp option included transportation and meals. Camp SOAR provided a Summer of Outdoor Adventure and Recreation to children who, otherwise, would not have the opportunity to attend summer camp.

MEMORY CAFÉ

With a focus on preventative health and managing chronic disease, our Somerset Hills YMCA launched a Memory Café to support and connect caregivers and their care partners living with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia. The new program, which began in the fall of 2022, is off to a strong start. Once monthly, the group meets for a light meal, to socialize, and to enjoy relaxing activities such as crafts, games, music, which stimulate the mind.

ACE PROGRAM

Accept, Compete, Excel (ACE) is a program through our Princeton YMCA designed to reduce chronic absenteeism from school by building connections and supports for students in grades 8–12 who are most at risk of falling behind. In the program, students benefit from positive relationships with volunteer mentors and social—emotional learning with the goal of improving attendance, academic performance, life trajectories, and opportunities for brighter futures.

SUMMER CAMP

Friendships, fun, and enriching experiences are so important to the personal growth of children. Summertime is an important opportunity for children to unleash the adventure in their hearts and connect with peers. Our Summer Camp offers a well-rounded approach to enriching the whole child through social-emotional, academic, character, and physical development. Additionally, we encourage campers to improve swim skills in our Go for Green program that inspires campers to progress toward a green band indicating an ability to swim in the deep end of the pool.

FOOD SECURITY

Food insecurity continues to be an ongoing health concern among local families. With the belief that everyone deserves access to basic essentials, we continued our food security initiatives. Through the generous support of corporate partners and Y members, and in collaboration with local organizations, we distributed food distribution to hungry neighbors and offered a Little Free Pantry with staple food and household products.

MEET OLENA, MAKS & POLINA

"When the war broke out, my children and I fled to Romania and then to New Jersey where we have family; but, my husband remains in Ukraine. At first, they were shy and didn't speak English well, but they made friends quickly. Without the Y's financial assistance, I would not have been able to afford camp. YOUNG ACHIEVERS

Princeton Young Achievers (PYA) is a unique after-school program that helps children from low- and moderate-income neighborhoods improve their school performance and English language skills. Daily, Y staff and devoted volunteers work together to help children in Kindergarten through 5th grade with homework assistance, STEM and enrichment activities, one-on-one tutoring, and literacy support.

WATER SAFETY

Swimming is a life skill that makes communities safer by preventing accidental drownings. We encourage children and adults, alike, to learn to be safe around water and develop strong swim skills. In addition to the Y's swim lessons, our no-cost Safety Around Water Program teaches essential knowledge and skills to help individuals of all ages to improve confidence and water safety.

TEEN LEADERS

Through vast opportunities, we encourage teens to engage in leadership-building opportunities. Our Student Advocates program opens the door for high school students to be involved with our Branch Boards and support the Y's mission. Through summer internships and part-time employment, teens gain professional skills. While our Summer Camp Counselor in Training program and various volunteer opportunities inspire teens through leadership skills and the rewards of mentorship.

Today's children are tomorrow's leaders, and developing future leaders has always been a pillar of the Y's work. We are committed to developing new generations of change-makers who will create communities we all want to live in—young people who grow into thriving adults and transform communities by influencing systems change, bridging social divides, and giving back. Our youth programs inspire kids to build relationships, resilience, understanding, empathy, and emotional maturity; to cultivate fundamental values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility; and to encourage positive behaviors for learning, work, and life to succeed now and in the future.

With youth development at the core of the Y's mission, we support children so they can succeed academically. Y staff and volunteers offer tutoring services to children in Kindergarten through 5th grade in order to accelerate learning.

Through our Swim Team, Gymnastics, Sports, and Dance programs, kids learn discipline, set personal goals, hone their skills, experience sportsmanship, and gain camaraderie – all while having fun.

1,281 FUTURE LEADERS

Parents entrust their children to us while they work with peace of mind knowing that their children are safe, happy, and learning. In our Early Learning Readiness, After School Care, and Academic Enrichment Programs we promote educational growth, strengthen socialemotional competencies, and instill important values for life.

In a world where much attention is on treating illness, we remain committed to improving individual and community health with emphasis on prevention. In the spring of 2022, we held a drive to collect much-needed items for families in war-torn Ukraine. With the support of our members, we collected enough to fill over 80 large boxes with donated items, which were shipped to Lviv so volunteers could distribute them to Ukranian families.

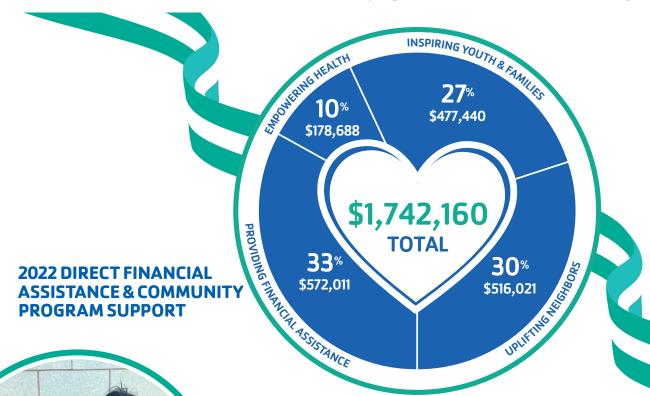
MEET LAUREN, JAY & CONNOR
