WINGS TO FLY New Camp SOAR

Every child deserves the opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive. This summer, we were thrilled to offer even more children with that opportunity. In July, we launched a new, five-week summer program called Camp SOAR for children from under-resourced families who live in Bound Brook, South Bound Brook, Manville, and Franklin Township. Camp SOAR was a collaborative program made possible by a grant from Somerset County, hosted by Franklin Township YMCA, and held at Colonial Park in partnership with the Somerset County Parks Commission.

The camp provided a Summer of Outdoor Adventure and Recreation (SOAR) to over 130 children of families who were disproportionately affected by the pandemic and Hurricane Ida. The affordable, enriching camp included transportation, daily meals, and a versatile setting for a myriad of activities, so parents could work without worry. Daily activities revolved around STEM, Arts & Crafts, Sports & Games, Nature Walks, Mini-golf, Splash Pad, Literacy, Summer Learning Loss Prevention, Social Emotional Learning, Team Building, and Character Development. Additionally, Camp SOAR offered a Counselor in Training Program for 7th, 8th, and 9th graders, and created 40 new job opportunities.

On August 5th, Congresswoman Bonnie Watson Coleman and Somerset County's Commissioners visited Camp SOAR. During the visit, the Congresswoman shared her gratitude, "For generations, the YMCA has been a fixture of communities in Somerset County. From providing outdoor recreation opportunities to offering extracurricular educational programs, I am so grateful for everything the Y has done for underserved youth," said Rep. Watson Coleman. "I'm committed to using my role as a member of Congress to advocate for investments in future generations. Camp SOAR will change children's lives, and I couldn't be prouder to support it."

Commissioner Doug Singleterry commented, "Congresswoman Watson Coleman is a leader who understands the importance of supporting vulnerable communities; they are the focus of this camp. When you look at the smiles on the faces of the children, you can't help but understand the life-changing impact these weeks of summer camp will have for many of the children."

Commissioner Director Shanel Robinson added, "We as a collective body of commissioners and elected officials at the county are appreciative of all the work the YMCA is doing, but more importantly that we are partnering with them to make this happen."

Our hope is that our campers and counselors gained lifelong memories, and that they've been inspired to soar to new heights.

BRIGHT FUTURES Fun Learning at Camp

Camp opens a door to new experiences for so many children, which was certainly true at Plainfield YMCA this summer. Beyond traditional activities, such as sports, games, art, and science, Plainfield campers also had the benefit of social-emotional learning, swim lessons, and other enrichment activities like archery. What was the best part of it all? To them, it was all just FUN! Thanks to the support of our donors, there were many "firsts" for our campers...the first time making friends; the first time being in a structured program as many did not have the opportunity to attend preschool; and, the first time learning to swim. SAFE HAVENY's Foundational Experiences

This summer Congressman Tom Malinowski visited Hillsborough YMCA to eagerly learn more about the Y's reinvestment plans for the facility, which will allow the Y to deepen its mission impact.

During his visit, Mr. Malinowski enjoyed a tour of summer camp and meeting with camp counselors and campers. He was especially pleased to meet campers Maksym and Polina, who are 11 year–old twins from Kyiv, Ukraine. The twins are staying in New Jersey with their mother and relatives while their father remains in the war–torn country. Maksym and Polina shared how much they were learning at camp and, particularly, how much they enjoyed playing sports including basketball and soccer. Thanks to the support of our donors, the children are in the Y's safe, nurturing environment making friends.

Mr. Malinowski, who was born in Communist Poland during the height of the Cold War, shared with Maksym and Polina that, when he was six, he and his mother fled to the United States and he grew up in Central Jersey. He added that the YMCA played an important role in his early years that helped change the trajectory of his life. "I was thrilled to connect with camp counselors and children enjoying the last days of summer camp. They are why we do this — to provide opportunity and access to everyone in our community," said Mr. Malinowski.

A significant, and highly rewarding, aspect of the Y's purpose is helping young people to discover their potential. With the support of our benefactors and partners, we open doors to resources and possibilities for local children and teens by tapping into social capital, as well as providing experiences that broaden their perspectives and their worlds.

Princeton YMCA's ACE (Accept Compete Excel) program has been successful at reducing chronic school absenteeism by building connections and supports for 8-12th grade students who are most at risk of falling behind and lowering their chances of future success. Our Princeton YMCA team consistently seeks opportunities to keep ACE students engaged and learning, which led to a partnership with YMCA of the Pines. As part of its summer camp offerings, YMCA of the Pines offers a nationwide Y-USA summer experience called BOLD & GOLD (Boys & Girls Outdoor Leadership Development).

This summer, Princeton YMCA was able to connect several of the ACE program students with the opportunity to participate in the BOLD & GOLD camp. The rigorous, outdoor leadership experience gives the teens a deeper understanding of their own lives, and inspires them to be effective, inclusive changemakers in a global society. The camp is steeped in activities that teach initiative, adaptability, communication skills, accountability, and responsibility.


Summer Interns
